# **MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL**





2025 Kindergarten and Pre-primary enrolments cut off- Friday, 19 July 2024.

The office has fielded several enquiries from members of our school community regarding the Kindergarten and Pre-primary enrolment process for the 2025 school year.

As a general rule, Kindy and Pre-primary applications need to be submitted to the school by the close of business on the first Friday of Term 3. This means that the cut-off date for this year will be **Friday**, **19 July.** Children starting Kindergarten need to be 4 years old by 30 June 2025, whilst children starting Pre-primary need to be 5 years old by 30 June 2025. **Please Note: Students who are currently enrolled in the school's Pre-primary program will be automatically enrolled in our Year 1 program commencing in 2025.** 

As Pre-primary is the first compulsory year at school, all current Kindergarten children who reside within our local intake area will have a guaranteed Pre-primary place for 2025. However, in order to secure a place, parents/caregivers will need to come up to the office and sight the original enrolment application used to enrol your child(ren) in Kindergarten, note any changes (if any), and then initial and date the documents. Parents/caregivers of our current Kindy cohort will receive notification via Connect in the coming weeks about when to come to the office to complete the 2025 Pre-primary enrolment process. By completing this process, parents/caregivers will secure a place for Pre-primary in 2025 and the school will be able to plan classes accordingly. Unfortunately, parents/caregivers of children currently enrolled in Kindergarten who live outside the school's local intake area do not have access to a guaranteed Pre-primary place. If the school has capacity, all applications from our current Kindy families residing outside our local intake area will be assessed against the Department of Education's *Enrolment* policy. The policy assigns a particular priority order by which all applications are assessed before a place is offered to any child. If the school does not have capacity, parents/caregivers will be directed to your local school- wherever this may be.

The following documentation must be provided when completing an enrolment for a new student:

- Proof of residence to be lodged with your application (e.g. council rates notice or rental agreement longer than three months **and** current utilities bill or bank statement).
- Your child's birth certificate/passport/visa, child's up to date immunisation records and child's medical information (asthma, allergies etc.)
- Parents' passport and visa details if born overseas.

In order to simplify the enrolment process, the school has developed several fillable forms that are available on the <u>Parent Information</u> page on the school website. Once you have completed all the sections on the enrolment form, simply hit the **Submit** button on page 10 to lodge your application.

If any parent/caregiver has any questions about any aspect of the enrolment process, please make contact with Mrs Nielsen or Mrs Reddish in the school office.

Thank you to Michelle Murphy from Mercy Physiotherapy whose kind donation to the school has enabled us to purchase lots of new games, equipment and construction toys for the **SMART class** awards.

At each fortnightly assembly, four classes receive the award – one from each of our teaching blocks. The recipients are chosen by our student councillors, who during the fortnight leading to an assembly, visit classes at recess and lunchtimes with a checklist to determine how SMART each class is. They are looking to see that:

- Lights and interactive whiteboards are off.
- Doors are closed.
- Windows are open for rooms with evaporative air conditioning and closed for rooms with reverse cycle air conditioning.
- Student bags are neatly stored.
- Area outside of classroom is rubbish free.

In other words, Secure, Mindful, Aware, Responsible and Tidy.

The award boxes are brimming with lots of new items that stay in the 'winners' classrooms for the fortnight and can be accessed by students in the classrooms before school and when they have 'free time' in class.
